

# If you are selected, you would be responsible for:


- 1. Attending monthly meetings (On Zoom or in-person at 40 Rector Street, NYC).

Dear AAP Members,

It's that time of year again!!! Time to start thinking about your students who are doing exceptional works of service, so that you can nominate them for a Martin Safran Award.

Also, as a current AAP member, if you have a graduating high school child who is going to college next September, you may apply for one of three, \$1,000 Stewart Weiner Scholarships! Here's information on both programs, which are only available to AAP members in good standing.

Martin Safran Citizenship Award--Each year we award 15 students (in grades K-8) this important citizenship award to recognize their exemplary service to their schools and/or communities. We encourage you to fill out applications for your students who have been making a difference in their own ways, large or small. AAP-member Assistant Principals may nominate up to 3 students from their school. Students should write an essay, answering the questions on the application about their service. The winners will be celebrated during our annual awards dinner in June, where they will receive \$200 and a beautiful award. We hope all of you will nominate students. <u>Stewart Weiner Scholarship Program</u>--If you have a child graduating from high school this year, this scholarship program is for you! We will award scholarships (\$1,000 each!) to children of current AAP members. Scholarship winners are selected based on the following: their response to a biographical questionnaire, resume, two letters of recommendation (by their principal, teacher and/or guidance counselor), academic standing (official school transcript) and secondary school report by their principal or guidance counselor. All forms are in the <u>application</u>.
